It should contain background information and a statement of the author's hypothesis. An introduction raises a specific research question and poses a specific hypothesis to be tested (Times New Roman 10 pt).

**Methods (Times New Roman Bold 10 pt):** In this section you explain how you carried out your study or experiment and which materials have been used. The methods describe both specific techniques and the overall experimental strategy used by the researchers (Times New Roman 10 pt).

**Results (Times New Roman Bold 10 pt):** The function of the result section is to objectively present your key results and data, without interpretation. It can contain important information in text, quantitative data, figures and tables. (Times New Roman 10 pt).

**Discussion and Conclusion (Times New Roman Bold 10 pt):** The discussion section interprets the results in the light of what was already known about the subject and describes what the work suggests and how it relates to other studies. In this section, authors can anticipate and address any possible objections to their work. The authors may suggest areas of improvement for future researches in the discussion section (Times New Roman 10 pt).

**(Introduction, Methods and Materials, Results, Discussion and Conclusion totally must contain up to 300 words)**

**Keywords (Times New Roman Bold 10 pt):** first keyword, second keyword ... (3-6 words, Times New Roman 10 pt)

**References (Times New Roman Bold 10 pt):** Each abstract must cite two primary articles as literature review. The style for references is based on Vancouver system (Times New Roman 10 pt).
